# GROWING IN FAITH AND FELLOWSHIP

## CONVERSATIONS BETWEEN CHURCH LEADERSHIP, MEMBERS, & LEADERS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE OVER POLITICAL STANCES

For many years there have been conversations at Deacon and Cabinet meetings about the political positions taken by leaders and delegates of the Massachusetts and National Conference. Some FCC Hanover church members believe that the positions are troublesome and the rhetoric inflammatory. Some church members perceive this as not encouraging an environment of civility, moderation, and the acceptance of multiple ideas. In June of this year this issue became more in the forefront after the Boston Globe published an article which stated, "Delegates representing about 600 United Church of Christ congregations in Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Connecticut voted in June to form an alliance to join together to help launch an organized, progressive Christian voice to counter right-wing religious forces in US politics."

While Rev. Eric was on sabbatical this past summer Moderator Jamaal Thompson did a superb job listening to concerns. It was decided that when Rev. Eric returned from sabbatical a meeting would be arranged with Jamaal Thompson, Rev. Eric, Rev. Don Remick (Transitional Interim Conference Minister of the Massachusetts), and Rev. Patty Kogut (Associate Conference Minister of the Southern Area). A video conference meeting was held in October. Don and Patty were generous with their time, listened to the concerns, told us about two books they suggested we read as a congregation, and Don's willingness to come to the church and preach a sermon and have a conversation with church members about their concerns. In response to the meeting Rev. Eric proposed an initial plan of possibly doing a sermon series on one of the books suggested starting January 6 and then have Don come to the church and preach on a Sunday in February or March. Plans are still being discussed. Stay tuned for further updates.

### "BUY A KEY" ON THE NEW CHURCH ORGAN






## HANOVER HELPS THE HOMELESS
